Lilian Thuram

Lilian Thuram was born in Guadeloupe in 1972. The accomplished author and social justice activist was formerly a professional soccer player who had an illustrious international career from 1991–2008, including a 1998 World Cup championship for France. He holds the record for the most selections on France's national team and has been a member of an impressive number of championship squads.

Mr. Thuram is the author of four critically acclaimed books: Mes etoiles noires: de Lucy a Barack Obama/My Black Stars: From Lucy to Barack Obama (2010) which received the Seligmann Prize against Racism; Pour l'égalite/ For Equality (2014); Notre Histoire/Our History (2017); and La pensée blanche: On ne naît pas blanc, on le devient/White Thinking: Behind the Mask of Racial Identity (2020). He is the founder of the Lilian Thuram Foundation, a leader in education against racism in France and abroad.
